Dear Friends:



This past year has been challenging, not only for our Federation, but also for Jewish communities throughout North America. Our greatest accomplishment was that we still succeeded despite so many reasons to fail. While campaigns around the country decreased, we were able to maintain our campaign base. This, in and of itself, is an incredible achievement.

Further, we have commenced initiatives that are a great reason for pride and satisfaction. Our PJ Library surpassed 260 subscriptions, delivering free books and CD's of Jewish content to children ages six months to six years of age. We participate in the One Happy Camper program providing subsidies for children to experience Jewish overnight camp for the first time. Our Jewish Education Committee provided the funding for nearly 50 teens in our community to visit the U.S. Holocaust Museum this spring. Shalom Baby welcomed new and expectant parents with a special care package delivered by a friendly face.

Engaging the community through myriad Federation programs build connections and support. From our annual Federation Shabbat that includes community participation and support from all seven congregations throughout Delaware to Federation's Mitzvah Day with hundreds of volunteers, we truly make a difference.

Ensuring the future of our Jewish community is a core priority, so Federation launched the Create A Jewish Legacy initiative this past fall. By educating and training our local agencies and synagogues on the importance of planned giving and endowments, we will build the Jewish community's foundation for tomorrow. We have also implemented the Emerging Leadership Project for grooming the next generation of community leadership. Each participant will serve on a Federation committee and/or agency board as we recruit a second ELP class over the summer months.

Bringing Israel into this community through our Community Shaliach builds a living bridge with our spiritual homeland. Our rejuvenated Israel & Overseas Committee oversaw the Israel Film Series and Yom Ha'Atzmaut communitywide event. See the faces of Ethiopian Jewish children in our Federation-supported Youth Outreach Center who are eager to learn and become part of Israeli society. See the true sense of partnership we feel with the people of Israel through our 12-year relationship with Arad through Partnership2Gether. Israel is a constant factor in our lives, our hearts and our consciousness.

We ensure that no Jew goes hungry, the frail and elderly are not neglected, the homeless are sheltered, the imperiled are rescued, and our future is assured through Jewish education. This commitment is true not just in Delaware and the Brandywine Valley but in Israel and throughout the world.

We have seen, in a very intimate way, what our Federation accomplishes. No other Jewish organization even remotely approaches touching more lives through what we and our beneficiaries and partners do than through the Federation system. From our youngest children to our senior citizens, Federation serves and protects our entire Jewish family as community convener.

All of this would not be possible without the efforts of many. We depend on volunteers; it is the lifeblood of this organization. It is the effort of hundreds of people who volunteer to be involved in the effort to raise desperately needed resources. It is the volunteers who are so dedicated and do such an extraordinary job in Campaign, Allocations, Community Relations, Women's Philanthropy, Young Leadership, Planned Giving, Israel & Overseas, and on and on. Thank you for what you have made possible.

Our Federation is a product of understanding the fundamental principle that "each Jew is responsible one for the other." In the challenges that inevitably lie ahead, this will be the guiding vision that will enable our Federation to save, enhance, educate, assist, and inevitably touch more Jewish lives.







JEWISH FUND FOR THE FUTURE

The Jewish Fund for the Future, the planned giving and endowment arm of the Federation, ensures the vitality and future of our Jewish community in Delaware, Israel and throughout the world. The Jewish Fund for the Future works with individuals and families along with Federation beneficiary agencies and area synagogues to create Jewish legacies.

Starting in 1985 with under \$300,000, the fund has grown to nearly \$20 million in endowments assets. Overseeing more than 100 community endowment funds, the Jewish Fund for the Future fulfills the donor's intent by providing support for new programs, stabilizing existing programs and supplementing agency and synagogue needs.

The Jewish Fund for the Future can work directly with the donor to meet their personal, family and financial charitable goals. Donors can establish their endowment fund now and fund it in the future through a bequest or other source. Endowment funds have been established using cash, securities, real estate or other property, life insurance, IRA or pension plan assets, a charitable trust and private foundation grants.

Ten new endowment funds were created this past year. These new funds contributed towards the \$1.3 million received by the Jewish Fund for the Future. Distributions from the Jewish Fund for the Future, totaling over \$1.12 million, benefited a diverse array of cultural, educational, social and humanitarian causes.

GRANTHIGHLIGHTS

A partial list includes:

- \$561,252 went directly to Delaware Jewish agencies and synagogues for program support
- \$280,146 for the Jewish Federation of Delaware to help build our local Jewish community
- \$105,000 in grants went to Israel
- \$48,080 was distributed for scholarships, an increase of \$12,000 over the previous year

The remaining funds supported National Jewish organizations as well as other local and national nonprofit agencies.
