July 6, 2022, Wilmington, DE – Jewish Federation of Delaware landed a Third-Place winning entry in the 2022 National Communications Contest sponsored by the National Federation of Press Women for its monthly publication.

The annual contest is two-tiered. The first tier of the contest is the statewide competition sponsored by the Delaware Press Association (DPA). The second tier is the national competition, run by the National Federation of Press Women (NFPW).

A distinguished group of professional journalists, communications specialists and educators judged nearly 2,000 entries in a wide variety of categories. Only first-place winning entries at the state level are eligible to enter the national contest. All entries were published or broadcast between January-December 2021.
